

Explore Easton's Treasures *

Town's West Side

- **Aspetuck Historic District**, Redding Road from Mile Common to Black Rock Turnpike,* settlement began here in the late 17th Century with a mill on the river
- **Old Center Street Methodist Church** (1845) at West Rd, now a private home
- **"Toy Factory,"** Old Redding Rd and Westport Rd, site of the original mill
- **Helen Keller House** at Redding Rd and Westport Rd
- **Aspetuck Park**, Redding Rd and Black Rock Tpke, baseball field, fishing pond, picnic areas, far back trails
- **Gilbertown Cemetery**, abutting park, graves of Samuel Staples and several Revolutionary War soldiers
- **Center Street Cemetery** (1861), across the road with many Civil War soldiers
- **Bluebird Inn**, adjacent to park, quaint spot for a delicious breakfast, brunch, or lunch (since 1919)
- **Olde Bluebird Garage**, north of park on Black Rock Tpke, gas and repairs, family owned since 1936, scenic views of the Aspetuck Reservoir
- **Trout Brook Valley trails**, Freeborn Rd
- **Bradley Hubbell House** (1816), 535 Black Rock Tpke, Historical Society of Easton (closed)
- **Aspetuck Apple Barn**, 714 Black Rock Tpke, local apples, jellies, honey, condiments, gifts, plants, etc.
- **Jump Hill trails**, park across from Country Club Ln
- **Saugatuck and Aspetuck Centennial Watershed trails**, half mile north of Country Club Ln
- **Den Road**, once home to Easton's free Black families, now part of the above trails, several old foundation walls
- * In April 1777, the British forces marched along Black Rock Tpke on the way to the Battle of Ridgefield

Center of Town, West

- **Congregational Church** (1835) on the hill, replaced the original 1763 meeting house
- **Staples Academy** (1795) second free secondary school in the country
- **Greiser's Coffee & Market**, charming café, market, and gift shop open for breakfast and lunch; Old Easton Center Antiques store is in the rear of the 220-year-old building
- **Adams School House** (1850), short walk to the west, Historical Society of Easton (open by appt)
- **Old Episcopal Church** (1874), now a private home.

Center of Town, East

- **Town Hall (1937) and Police Station**, the terminus of the Memorial Day Parade that starts from the Firehouse Green and proceeds down Center Rd
- **Ashlar-Aspetuck (Masonic) Lodge No. 142**, adjacent to Samuel P. Senior Park and trails
- **Easton Public Library**, books and so much more!
- **Old Samuel Staples Elementary School** (1930), now Easton Country Day and Speech Academy and Playscape
- **Notre Dame Roman Catholic Church**
- **Samuel Staples Elementary School** adjacent to Morehouse Athletic Fields
- **Easton Animal Shelter**

Sport Hill Road, South to North

- **Covenant Church of Easton**, site of the early 1900s Sport Hill automobile race
- One acre zoning up to Flat Road Rd, 3 acres everywhere else
- **Jessie Lee Methodist Church** (1815), Flat Rock Rd, first Methodist Church in NE
- **Sherwood Farm**, owned by the same family since 1700s; selling produce, meats, breads, pumpkins in season
- **Helen Keller Middle School**, tennis courts, playground, fields, sledding hill
- **Adjacent to HKMS**, dog park, community center, veteran's field, gazebo, skate park, Parks and Rec
- **Easton Village Store**, eat-in, take-out hot and cold foods, groceries
- **Easton Volunteer Fire Company**
- **Firehouse Green**, site of annual Fireman's Carnival late July/early Aug.
- **Easton Medical Services**
- **Silverman's Farm**, pick-your-own orchards, petting zoo, hayrides, cut Christmas trees, jams, condiments, gifts
- **St. Dimitrie Romanian Orthodox Church**
- **Snow's Farm**, mulch, gravel, topsoil, landscaping
- **Sport Hill Farm**, seasonal produce, eggs, meats, cheese, gifts, special events
- **Gilbertie's Herb Gardens**, Adams Rd, W. of Sport Hill, herbs, microgreens, eggs
- **North Park Ave & Surrounding area**, site of 1807 Weston Meteorite, 1st recorded meteorite fall in North America none of which fell in today's Weston
- **Steep Hill Open Space**, trail down to the Easton Reservoir off lower No. Park Ave
- **Randall's Farm Nature Preserve**, one mile North of Silverman's
- **Union Cemetery (1761)**, Westport Rd | Sport Hill Rd, 18th century to current
- **Old Baptist Church (1825)**, part of Black Rock Church, Fairfield
- **Christ Church Episcopal**, Church Road
- **Maple Row Growers**, Stepney Rd, mulch, topsoil, landscaping
- **Maple Row Christmas Tree Farm**, east on Sunny Ridge from Sport Hill Rd
- **Lyon Cemetery (1800)**, south of Sport Hill Road and Rock House intersection, 19th century burying ground

* accessible by car, bike, or foot
