



## Juvenile Fiction




***The Parker Inheritance*** by Varian Johnson (Ages 8-12)  
A masterfully written, important and inspired mystery that addresses racism and bullying, past and present. A great choice for historical fiction, mystery, and social justice fans.




***How to Become a Planet*** by Nicole Melleby (Ages 9-12)  
A coming-of-age story that deals with depression, anxiety, and identity. Can a new therapist and a gender-questioning friend help Pluto on her path of discovery?




***Ollie in Between*** by Jess Callans (Ages 10-13)  
A tender coming of age story about finding your voice and choosing to live authentically, even when it's easier to blend in.



***Melissa*** (formerly published as *George*) by Alex Gino (Ages 8-12)  
An honest, kid-friendly look at being transgender that will stay with the reader for a long while.



***Ana on the Edge*** by A.J. Sass (Ages 8-12)  
An honest coming-of-age story about a nonbinary character navigating a binary world.




***Too Bright to See*** by Kyle Lukoff (Ages 8-12)  
Following his uncle's death, a transgender boy about to enter middle school deals with grief, friendship, identity and...a ghost. Author Lukoff expertly blends mystery with identity in this coming-of-age and coming out story.

## Juvenile Graphic Novels



***The Cardboard Kingdom*** by Chad Sell (Ages 9-13)  
A colorful, inventive graphic novel about the power of friendship, imagination, and identity.



***Snapdragon*** by Kat Leyh (Ages 9-14)  
This graphic novel about middle school student Snapdragon is full of magic and humor and offers a joyful and affirming representation of complicated families.



***The Legend of Auntie Po*** by Shing Yin Khor (Ages 10-14)  
Exploring themes of privilege, racism, and identity, this historical graphic novel shines a light on the power of sharing stories.



***Princess Princess Ever After*** by Katie O'Neill (Ages 8-13)  
Two very different princesses embark on a journey to defeat their evil nemesis and discover what happily ever after means for them.



***Lunar Boy*** by Jes & Cin Wibowo (Ages 9-13)  
A young trans boy from the moon discovers home in the most unlikely places. A story of change, understanding, identity, and belonging.




***The Ribbon Skirt*** by Cameron Mukwa (Ages 8-12)  
In this tender novel full of hope. Anang a two-spirit, nonbinary, indigenous 10-year-old knows exactly who they are. Can they help others understand?






